- The site is of significant aesthetic value, being graded high local heritage significance in terms of the recommended CoCT grading system
- The site has strong intangible heritage value in its direct association with the development of race-based and class-based education policies of the government at the time of its establishment.
- The school has an association with slavery as it served a community comprising predominantly the descendants of the freed slaves.
